

2008 Army Traffic Safety Training Program at Ft. Belvoir

The ATSTP was developed by IMCOM, the Installation Management Command, to attack the rising number of vehicle-related accidents and to standardize the Army's traffic safety education program. The Army Traffic Safety Training Program targets the Secretary of Defense mandated **50% reduction** in accidents and fatalities.

Who's required to take this program?

All military personnel under 26 years of age who possess a driver's license shall be given a three hour classroom course within 30days after arriving to Fort Belvoir. RECOMMEND, BUT not mandatory for DoD Civilians.

Local Traffic Hazards Course II (First 30 minutes)

All military personnel and DoD Civilians who are new to Ft. Belvoir and unaware of local driving hazards are at increased risk of a roadway collision. Students will learn relevant information on below information:

- Local statistics.
- Local case studies.
- Local driving and weather conditions.
- Driver's license manual, MVA website, and unique traffic laws for Virginia.
- Information on local training in the use of child restraints.
- Contact information for local support services for anger management, behavior health, drug and alcohol abuse, etc.

Intermediate Course IIIA (Last two and a half hours)

Intermediate Course IIIA builds on the themes introduced during Introductory Course 1 (given to AIT/OSUT students) and provides expanded opportunity for class interaction and discussion.

The last two and a half hours covers "RISK MANAGEMENT".
